#### A highlight from 2023,

World Vision International in Viet Nam has entered a new five-year phase and thus launched the Fiscal Year 2023-2027 (FY23-27) strategy as our promise to vulnerable children. We set a strategic goal of achieving the sustained wellbeing of three million children, especially the most vulnerable. Equivalently, it is echoed in our four main break-down goals: an increase in children who have positive and peaceful relationships in their families and communities; an increase in girls and boys protected from violence; children report an increased level of wellbeing, including an increase in development assets and life skills; increase in children protected from infection and diseases. We also keep integrating community-based approaches, green humanitarian action, gender equality, disability, and social inclusion into our programme design and implementation.

Our FY23-27 strategy also closely aligns with and supports Viet Nam development programmes.

#### On the other hand,

we are encountering numerous challenges. Despite fast-paced economic growth, Viet Nam is encountering poverty gaps and other troubling trends. Moreover, climate emergency poses another threat to the wellbeing of our vulnerable children and community. In 2023, over 1,100 natural disasters hit Viet Nam, leaving 1,129 people dead and missing.

Vulnerable children, especially those in remote areas, are facing significant hurdles. One out of five children under five is malnourished, and only one out of three people in rural areas have access to clean water. Many children are subjected to violence and abuse, physically and psychologically.

Such obstacles did not stop our committed and dedicated staff from serving the most vulnerable children and communities in Viet Nam. With their dedication and the generosity of our donors, we were able to positively affect the lives of 208.980

children, including 182,029 of the most vulnerable ones who were served and benefited from programmes relevant to their needs in Fiscal Year 2023.



# Child Protection & Participation

In Viet Nam, among the child population of 24.8 million, almost 7% are considered the most vulnerable children (MVC).

World Vision International in Viet Nam identified critical interlinked issues in child protection, including physical and sexual abuse, peer violence, online violence, child trafficking, child labour, and child marriage.

12,230

parents and caregivers participated in the Happy Families course and Positive Discipline training, which sought to ensure families enjoy positive and loving relationships.

34,050

Children's Clubs members improved life skills knowledge and practice. 3,292

at-risk children, victims of violence and abuse and their families were supported through Home Visiting or Case Management services. In total, 9,125 children were supported since 2020.

Children's Club is a World Vision child sponsorship's central strategy to create long-lasting changes for children. The model enables Linh and her peers to cultivate different skills as well as tackle social norms that hold children back.

At the 7th National Children's Forum 2023, Linh represented children's voice and suggested local authorities to restrict tobacco use in her commune to make her neighbourhood more children-friendly.



#### Livelihoods

To tackle food insecurity, climate change's disruptive impact, and to increase the number of well-nourished children, World Vision International in Viet Nam supported families in meeting their immediate food needs as well as in recovering and developing sustainable livelihoods.

13,124

households participated in livelihoods trainings.

28,858

children have their wellbeing improved as a result of an increase in family financial assistance, productivity and resources. 3,552

individuals received technical or vocational training

43

market connections were created by producer groups.

04

proposals made by villagers contributed to the improvement of policy practice. 14,429

Saving for Transformation (S4T) group members saved a total amount of USD 758,473.

7,360

people received financial assistance from 760 active Saving for Transformation (S4T), with a total amount of USD 698,091.









#### **Health & Nutrition**

The malnutrition rate among Vietnamese children under five years old is still high, with stunting prevalence at 19.6%. There is also a massive disparity in child malnutrition among different parts of the country, with stunting prevalence recorded among ethnic minority children at 31.4%.

Viet Nam's National Nutrition Strategy aims to reduce child malnutrition to under 15% by 2025 and under 12% by 2030. To support this national goal, World Vision International in Viet Nam has implemented our Health and Nutrition Programme in 17 Area Programmes (FY23). Besides, we actively led the Civil Society Alliance for Scaling Up Nutrition movement (SUN CSA) and collaborated with the Ministry of Health on technical support.

1,141

children participated in nutrition rehabilitation sessions 1,500

active Child Caregiver Clubs across more than 40 districts contributed to the reduction of malnutrition rates through integrated interventions at community level. 80

policies were adopted/improved in implementation by local and national government decision-makers, with contributions from World Vision, aimed at improving the health and nutrition status of Vietnamese children, especially the most vulnerable ones.

4,728

pregnant women and mothers with children under 24 months of age were counselled to take better care of their children and themselves. 4,340

children under 2 years old benefited from counselling service on health and nutrition care. 25,729

children under 5 years old served by counselling service on health and nutrition care through Timed and Targeted Counselling model.







#### WASH – Water, Sanitation and Hygiene

World Vision International in Viet Nam's WASH interventions ensure access to safe and clean drinking water, handwashing facilities, latrines, sanitation and hygiene services in schools and communities. Though our WASH activities, we contributed to the reduction of diseases among children caused by unclean water and poor sanitation and hygiene.

10,463

people gained access to basic drinking water services. 1,555

households started waste management at their home.

1,930

households built/ upgraded their sanitation facilities. 2,991

sensitised households had handwashing facilities installed.

4,477

households received communication messages on water treatment method and safe storage at home.









#### **Sponsorship Programme**

Our Sponsorship Programme built a Bridge of Love between sponsors from 12 countries with children and communities in Viet Nam.

78,300

children registered in World Vision International in Viet Nam's Sponsorship Programme. 87.3%

of children registered in our Sponsorship Programme are the Most Vulnerable Children (MVC)





96%

of Registered Children who had been in the Sponsorship Programme for 3 months or more benefited from at least 3 programme activities through our core sectors of Child Protection & Participation, Health & Nutrition, and Livelihoods.

#### Digitalisation

The sponsorship experience has been further elevated through the use of digitalization and new initiatives such as letter-writing contest, Photo & Video of Happy Day which promote children's participation in community activities.

#### **Disaster Risk Reduction & Climate Resilience**

With a coastline stretching 3,440 kilometers combined with a diverse and complex topography, Viet Nam suffers from many different types of natural hazards.

World Vision International in Viet Nam works with communities and partners to develop and implement disaster preparedness plans as well as build a strong network of rapid response teams at district, commune and village levels.

#### 440

rapid response teams at the grassroots level had their capacity enhanced through training and simulations.

486

communities updated their disaster preparedness plans













# SPECIAL PROJECTS

World Vision International in Viet Nam explores additional funding sources through Special Projects to address specific community child wellbeing issues.

These include addressing violence and abuse against children, providing life skills and living values education for children, enhancing mothers' and children's health, tackling online safety, and so forth.

A Special Project lasts one to four years and is integrated with Area Programmes' activities. World Vision International in Viet Nam implemented over 10 Special Projects in FY23.


