

TERMS OF REFERENCE TOT TRAINING ON "GENDER, GENDER EQUITY"

I. BACKGROUND

Hoa Binh is a mountainous province in the northern part of Vietnam with a population of around 910,000 people. The poverty rate in the province is 25%. In 10 districts of Hoa Binh province, there are a total of 95 extremely difficult communes, mainly in mountainous districts with difficultly economic conditions such as Lac Son, Da Bac, Mai Chau, and Kim Boi districts. In particular, due to the specific conditions of location and topography, Da Bac and Mai Chau are two districts that still face many limitations in socio-economic development, so the percentage of poor households and near poor in these two districts is quite high (Da Bac: 43.33% and Mai Chau: 29.22% - Source: Decision of Hoa Binh PPC # 2857/QĐ-UBND, 2020).

According to the results of the Nutrition Census in 2020, Hoa Binh province belongs to the group of provinces with a higher malnutrition rate than the national average (underweight rate was 15.5% and stunting rate was 24.3% compared to the national average of 11.5% and 19.6%, respectively). In comparison with other districts in the provinces supported by WV Vietnam, the proportion of malnourished children in Da Bac and Mai Chau districts in general and in the target communes in particular are still very high (In 2020, the stunting rate and underweight rate for Da Bac was 27.7% and 20.2%; and Mai Chau was 28.6% and 19.2% respectively).

Da Bac and Mai Chau districts are the home of 7 ethnic groups, accounting for 72% of the population. Main characteristics of the ethnic minorities (Muong, Dao, Thai...) in these areas is that they consider pregnancy and childcare as the duties of the women. Husbands play a limited participation and interest in addressing this issue. Women are often disadvantaged in accessing health care services and resources for themselves and their children.

Therefore, apart from the interventions related to the mothers, the influence on the husband, who influences the decision-making in maternal health care and children is essential. The "Men care for kids" project is designed for strengthening the role of husbands to improve children's nutritional status with integrated approaches.

To increased awareness of community about gender and gender equity, there is a need in organizing training on "Gender equity" for core partner and family.

II. TRAINING OBJECTIVES AND EXPECTED OUTCOME

I. Training objectives

After the training, the participants will:

- Be equipped with basic knowledge on "Gender equity".
- > Be able to reflect on gender concepts and issues.
- > Be able to develop plans, design lectures and retrain members of the "Father clubs"

2. Expected results:

- 100% of participants will have basic knowledge on "Gender equity".
- 90% of participants will have skills on approach to mainstream gender in program management.
- 70% of the participants will able to develop plans, design lectures and retrain members of the "Father clubs".

Session 1: Summary about the training and guideline on find some gender issues in community. Session 2: Summary about the condition accessing to gender equity and the practice of community

people.

Session 3: Key concepts, (Gender, Gender stereotype and gender norms, Gendered division of labour, Factors shape and reinforce Gender inequality, Gender equality and equity)

Session 4: Group reflection on representation of gender stereotypes, norms and division of labour in daily life.

Session 5: Gender mainstreaming in program management structure

Session 6: Guideline on implementing the communication activities.
